Topics include:

June 29: Spend time exploring the estuary and the unique organisms found there. Learn about current research and use sampling equipment to collect animals and investigate their unique adaptations to life in the sand. Get ready to get dirty!

July 13: Come explore mysterious drifters as we collect plankton using nets, examine them with microscopes and try to determine what they will become as adults. Learn how plankton adaptations help them sink or swim, then design and create your own plankton model to race against other families!

July 20: Discover the wondrous world of invertebrates through dissections, presentations, and hands-on activities. Participants will collect and sort organisms based on their physical characteristics.

August 3: It's that time of year again on the Gulf Coast, get the Sea Turtle facts first-hand on conservation, anatomy, and nesting from people working the front lines to protect them

August 17: Look but don't touch these beautiful stingers; find out what are cnidarians, jellyfish, hydras, anemones as well as the importance of coral reefs and conservation efforts on their behalf.
